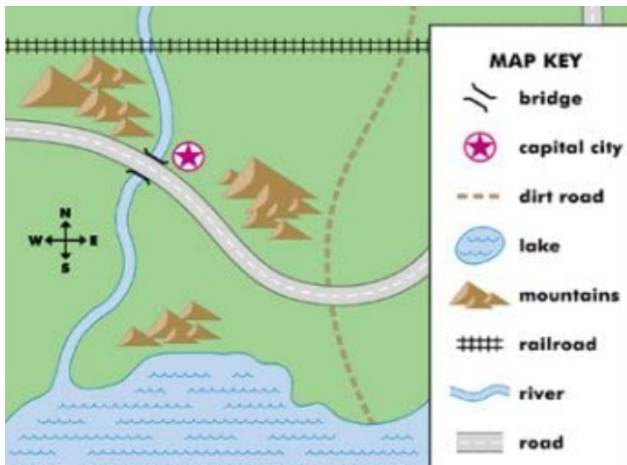
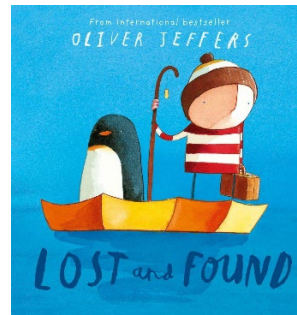

Key Vocabulary

Material

Wood, plastic, metal and glass are just some of the materials we use to make the things around us.

Wood

Wood is the hard substance found in the trunk and branches of trees and shrubs.

Plastic

Plastic is a material that can change its shape. Many things are made of plastic because making them the right shape is easy.

Fabric

Fabric is a cloth or other material made by weaving or knitting fibres.

Metal

Metal is a solid material which is typically hard, shiny, with good electrical and thermal conductivity.

Map

A map is a representation of an area of land, or sea showing the physical features.

Map's Key

A map's key explains what all the symbols mean and provides a scale.

Direction

Direction is the course along which someone or something moves.

Compass

A compass is an instrument that tells you the direction of North.

Did you know?

Penguins live in the Southern Hemisphere.

Most groups of penguins can be found in Antarctica, Argentina, Chile, New Zealand and South Africa.

Penguins belong to the bird family but they cannot fly. They have flippers instead of wings.

The South Pole is the coldest place in Antarctica and the coldest temperature recorded was -89.6 C.

Antarctica is the only continent where people do not permanently live. Scientists and support staff live there for part of the year.

The first person to reach the South Pole was Roald Amundsen.
